West Michigan Airport Authority Proposed Meeting Minutes September 9, 2013

Item 2.

The West Michigan Airport Authority Board met at the Westshore Aviation, 1585 South Washington Avenue, Holland.

Present: Authority Members Klynstra, Klunder, Hoogland, Wickmann, Toscano,

Matthysse, Dykstra, Wiersma, Martin, Student Representatives VanderKolk and DeLeau and Ex-Officio Members Storey and Disselkoen.

Absent: FBO Ron Ludema and Holland City Community Development Supervisor

Joel Dye.

Others Present: Communications Assistant Karen Scholten, Executive Assistant Sinka

Babinec and Assistant City Manager Greg Robinson.

The meeting began at 11:34 a.m. with an introduction of all Authority members present to the student representatives from Holland VanderKolk and DeLeau. Chairperson Klunder thanked Westshore Aviation for serving as host for the meeting.

13.09.01 Public Comments.

There were no public comments expressed at this meeting.

13.09.02 Consideration of the July 29, 2013 Meeting Minutes.

It was moved by Dykstra and supported by Matthysse to approve the July 29, 2013 meeting minutes as submitted. This motion was unanimously adopted.

13.09.03 FBO Report.

Due to the absence of Mr. Ludema, Mr. Robinson stated that the report was included in the packet and highlighted that: Fuel sales were close to what they were in August 2013; contributing to the fuel sales was the FBO charter sales being up 14% from August 2013; Wings of Mercy event turnout was excellent; the parade float check is on, painted and ready to be finished out for the Pumpkinfest parade in October; that a vehicle crash crashed into the east fence; and that a police report was made and the repair is in process.

The FBO Report was accepted as information.

13.09.04 Communications Committee Activities.

Ms. Scholten showed a video presentation highlighting the Wings of Mercy CareAffaire open house hold on Saturday, August 24, 2013 at the West Michigan Regional Airport. The event was a great success with \$21,000 raised to date. The float will make its appearance at the Zeeland's Pumpkinfest on Saturday, October 5, 2013 at 3 p.m. A brochure for promoting the new terminal is being designed and will be printed this week. Holland Public TV is helping with a new video project for the airport.

The Communications Committee Report was accepted as information.

13.09.05 Recommendation from the Building & Development Committee on an Airport Consultant.

Assistant City Manager Robinson provided background on the airport consultant selection process. Six (6) bids were received and were evaluated by the Building and Development Committee. The Airport Consultant Selection Committee comprised of Building and Development Subcommittee members reviewed the six (6) proposals and invited Mead & Hunt, Prein & Newhof, Burns & McDonnell and QoE Consulting. Mead & Hunt was the unanimous selection to be the Airport Consultant, with Prein & Newhof being the second choice, Burns & McDonnell being third choice.

Chairperson Klunder thanked the Building & Development Committee and staff for all their effort during the consultant selection process.

It was moved by Toscano and supported by Mattysse to approve the selection of Mead & Hunt as the WMAA Airport Consultant as recommended by the Building and Development Committee and direct staff to submit their recommendation to MDOT-AERO. This motion was approved unanimously.

13.09.06 Proposal to Conduct Pavement Crack Filling.

It was moved by Wickmann and supported by Wiersma to authorize staff to develop a contract with Scodeller Construction for the purposes of crack sealing both the runway and taxiway at the West Michigan Regional Airport at a cost not to exceed \$0.68 a linear foot, and, furthermore, not to exceed a total budget of \$20,000; and that this cost be funded through the Airport Authority working capital. This motion was approved unanimously.

13.09.07 Fiscal Year 2013 Audit – Engagement Letter with Rehmann Robson.

Mr. Robinson presented the Engagement Letter from Rehmann Robson for conducting the fiscal year 2013 audit. This firm has conducted the Authority's audits since the Authority became its own entity and has performed this responsibility well. An audit is vital to ensuring to the Board and community that the Authority's finances are properly monitored and accounted for. The cost for this year's audit is \$6,000 which is \$100 more than the cost of the fiscal year 2012 audit. The Board had budgeted \$5,800 for this purpose. Rehmann Robson is proposing a one-time fee of \$500 to cover additional Government Accounting Standards requirements.

It was moved by Hoogland and supported by Martin to approve to approve the Engagement Letter with Rehmann Robson for preparation of the fiscal year 2013 audit at a cost of \$6,500. This motion was approved unanimously.

13.09.08 Comments from Jim Storey on the Naming of Viewing Areas.

Ex-Officio Members Storey kindly requested naming the two (2) viewing areas after Bill Sikkels for his actively involvement with the Airport. Board Member Martin suggested also engraved plaques. His suggestion was well received by the Board. The Board referred Mr. Storey's suggestion to the Building and Development Committee for further review.

13.09.09 Monthly Budget and Investment Report.

It was moved by Klynstra and supported by Matthysse to accept as information the Monthly Budget and Investment Report as presented. This motion was unanimously adopted.

13.09.10 Next Meeting: October 14, 2013 at the Howard Miller Library and Community Center in Zeeland.

13.09.11 Other Business.

Mr. Robinson provided a report on recent activities and accomplishments achieved by the Authority related to the new terminal project. This report was accepted as information.

13.09.12 Adjournment.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 12:35 p.m.

Report on MAAE fall Conference

I have included here a recap of things that I feel stand out from the conference. They are not in any particular order and some contain my opinion.

- 1. The most important item is the passing of HB 4571, 4572 and 4677. These bills provide a long-term solution to funding for airports in the State of Michigan. There was some concern about funding for Public Education being hurt by the aviation bills but that has been resolved by HB 4677.
 So please contact your representative and request their vote in favor of passing these bills. (A copy of the MAAE letter is attached.)
- 2. Federal Funding for 2013 with the sequestration was at 2.3 Billion. The hope is to get back to 2.8 Billion for 2014 but that is not very likely. Also, because of the delay in the Congress Authorizing the release of funds many airports construction projects for 2013 were delayed.
- 3. The MDOT emphasized that all records for the Consultant selection process is kept on file. The FAA has reviewed some airport's process and they had not kept the records in place even though they used the proper procedures.
- 4. During the Environmental review we received a detailed report on Grand Rapids Airport deicing collection and processing program. It is a very expensive program that is way beyond the scope of what we would need here. I have spoken with Mead & Hunt about collection of de-ice fluids on the new apron and we are working on that process.
- 5. I spoke with Jim Cook from Prein & Newhof, Steve Moulten from Burns & McDonnell, and Mike Borta from Qoe about the Consultant selection process. The other two companies that submitted proposals were not in attendance at the Conference. Everyone felt we did a good job with our process. They were disappointed but not surprised at the results.
- 6. In the General Aviation Breakout session it was interesting what a wide variety of airports that were represented. Many are very small with 10 to 20 airplanes and only a small number of operations.
- 7. One of the important things about funding is that the FAA is beginning to look at the number of based airplanes as opposed to number of operations. So it is important to keep out Based aircraft records up to date. (Ours is current).
- 8. We had a discussion about obstructions. As an example Oakland Troy Airport approach charts came out prohibiting night instrument approaches to the airport. This was a surprise to the Airport Manager and he is trying to get information on what caused this to happen.

Our situation with the tree clearing was similar in that we were not given notice until we saw it on the approach charts. I then contacted FAA and found we had trees penetrating the approach surface. This took almost two years to resolve. It is vitally important that we be proactive and continuously watch for anything that could impact our approaches before the FAA finds something on a flight check.

9. Finally the MDOT Aeronautics has renewed their contract with WSI (Weather Services, Inc.). Steve Shultz from MDOT is requesting that we be set up so pilots can access WSI in our office from their IPADs so they do not need to sit down at the weather station to get information.

The **Michigan Association of Airport Executives** (MAAE) is the professional organization for airport executives throughout Michigan. The primary goal for MAAE is to assist airport executives in fulfilling their responsibilities to the airports and communities they serve. MAAE membership includes executives from large and medium size airports, as well as managers from smaller airports.

ISSUE BRIEFING: Legislative Proposal on Transportation Funding

The MAAE Board of Directors believes that it is in the best interest of MAAE and its members to support HB 4571 and HB 4572, sponsored by Representative Wayne Schmidt, which provides funding levels to help sustain and support future growth of the Michigan system of airports. MAAE also supports HB 4677, sponsored by Representative Phil Potvin, which ensures that our schools and local units of government are held harmless financially by redirecting State General Fund dollars to the School Aid Fund and Revenue Sharing.

FUNDING SOLUTIONS:

MAAE supports HB 4571 and HB 4572 because it provides a solution for the long term financial needs of Michigan's air transport system.

The bills simply remove the .03 cent excise tax and associated rebate for commercial airlines. In addition it exempts aviation fuel in Michigan from the 6% general sales tax.

The legislation additionaly creates an ad valorem tax of 4% on the wholesale price of aviation fuel. The revenue generated from the new tax will be dedicated to the State Aeronautic Fund entirely. This new tax structure creates a reliable long term revenue stream that is generated by the aviation industry and stays with aviation.

MAAE believes when HB 4571 and HB 4572 are fully implemented, they will provide much needed annual revenue for the State Aeronautics Fund (SAF) in order to restore its operating budget including discretionary programs currently suspended. Those programs include the Airport Awareness Marketing Grants, Small Community Air Service Grants and the Automated Weather Observation System. It would also restore the state/local funding programs currently suspended including: pavement paint marking, windsocks, turf runway marking and Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) training.

HISTORY & BACKGROUND:

Aviation generates an estmated \$19 billion in economic activity in the State of Michigan. Michigan airports support over 100,000 jobs at Michigan airports. There are over 50 million annual passengers,

1 billion pounds of air cargo/US mail annually. For every \$1 million invested 43 jobs are created thus proving that airports are economic engines.

The current funding structure is supported from a variety of sources with the majority of revenue coming from the 1929 aviation fuel tax of \$.03 per gallon. Due to the fact that the tax structure has remained unchanged for eighty three years, with the exception of a 50% rebate to commercial airlines, it no longer supports the administrative and capital responsibilities of MDOT's Office of Aeronautics (AERONAUTICS).

The 1929 Aviation fuel tax was implemented as a method to generate revenue for the promotion and development of aviation in the State of Michigan. The SAF was created in 1945 by PA 327, which facilitates the operation of the AERONAUTICS. As such, the SAF funds all of the vital aviation functions of AERONAUTICS as well as other critical programs previously mentioned in this briefing.

Without approval of HB 4571 and HB 4572, the following problematic issues are likely to occur soon:

- Loss of federal funds due to the inability to provide the required State matching funds.
- Loss of State/Local programs.
- Possible loss of some airports.
- Potential layoffs of MDOT Office of Aeronautics employees
- Significant deterioration of aviation infrastructure across the State resulting in significantly higher costs down the road.

MAAE encourages you to support HB 4571 and HB 4572 which invests in the Michigan Airport System. The future cannot be a mere extension of the past and doing nothing is simply no longer an option.
